Replacing the long-lived and well-known Myford ML8, the M17 was Myford's last venture into the wood-lathe market and sold in two versions, the Mk.1 and Mk.2. With drive by V-belts over multi-step pulleys, the UK-built 5-speed Mk. 1 is usually, but not always, found finished in red and black while the Taiwanese-constructed, variable-speed Mk. 2 is more usually in aquamarine.
